SUBJECT: PER-SAFETY AND HEALTH

Purpose. To provide information on Methamphetamine Lab dumps along roadsides.

Expiration Date. May 31, 2005.

Many times while traveling the roadsides or walking a farmer's field you stumble on a pile of trash. If you were to find paper towels, coffee filters, lithium batteries, starter fluid, plastic buckets, rock or table salt containers, iodine, glass bottles filled with separated liquid contents DO NOT OPEN! This is a sign that there may be a meth* lab located close by or that this is a meth lab dump.

If you come across contents such as the ones mentioned above, call the local authorities. Do not pick up or touch the anything because dangerous chemical reactions may still be taking place.

Each office will receive a "Meth Lab Refuse" poster under separate cover. Post in your office in a visible location.
